With EDIT Napoli, The painstaking dedication behind the creations of Alfaterna Marmi designed by Manufatto, Domenico Orefice and Chiara Scarpitti. The patient waiting by the kiln without which it would be impossible to make the simple, sophisticated terracotta pieces by Gaetano Di Gregorio. The minute and monumental interlocks of the glass chandeliers by Venice-based Sylcom. And the wager of creating a chair that is not the umpteenth seat, but an unusual encounter between aluminium and expanded polyurethane: an object with a hostile look that reveals its familiar, welcoming nature over time, like Comfort/ Uncomfort by Finemateria. Three months after the second edition, what remains of EDIT Napoli is above all the great value of time. And not just because the fair took place in a happy break between one
